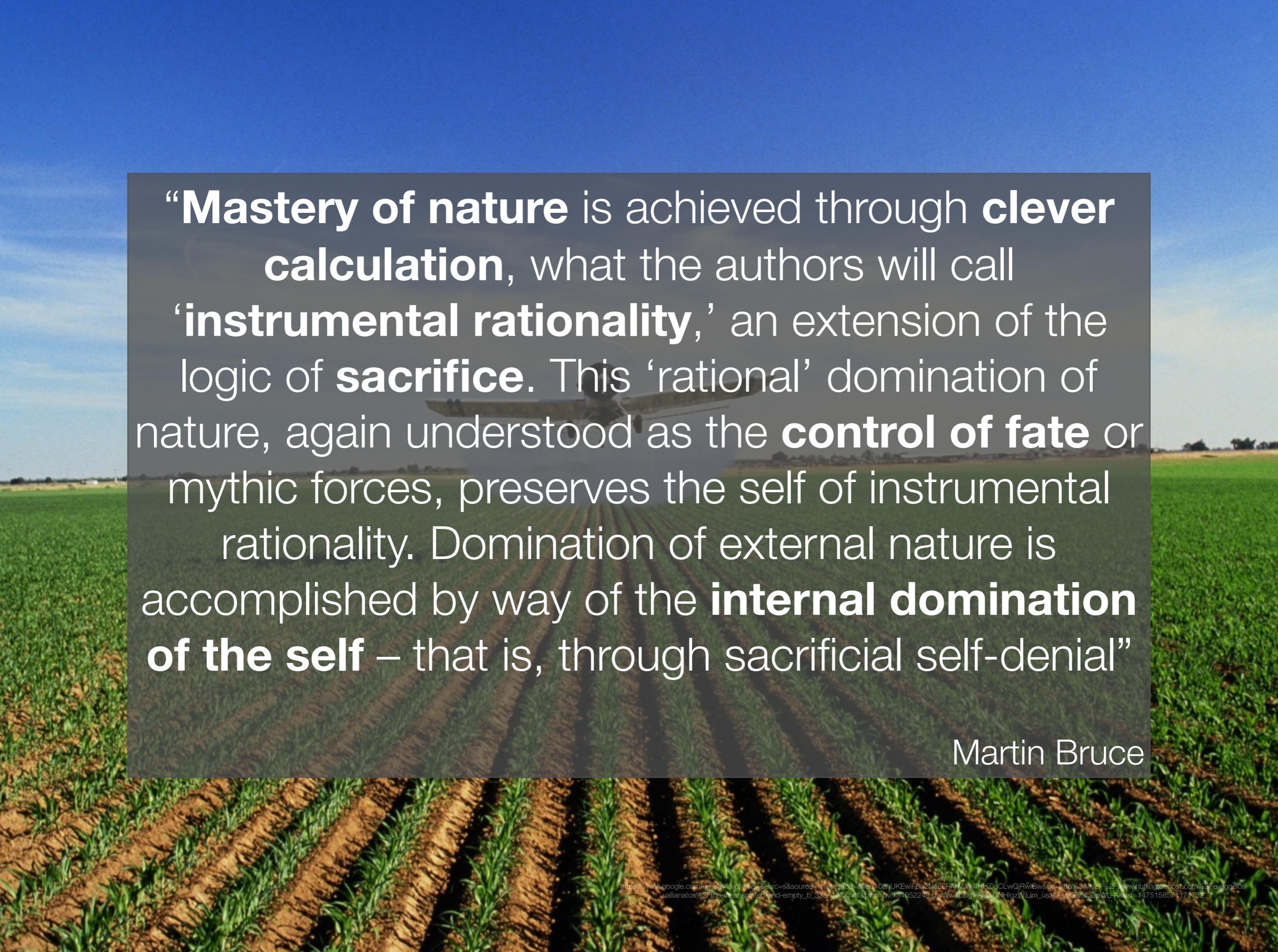
How Industry Works

"The knowledge acquired in craft work is **systemized logically**; the observable effects of this work become the object of **explanation** attempts. A new type of interaction with nature arises, supported first by architects and finally by engineers. They interact with nature by **calculating** it. 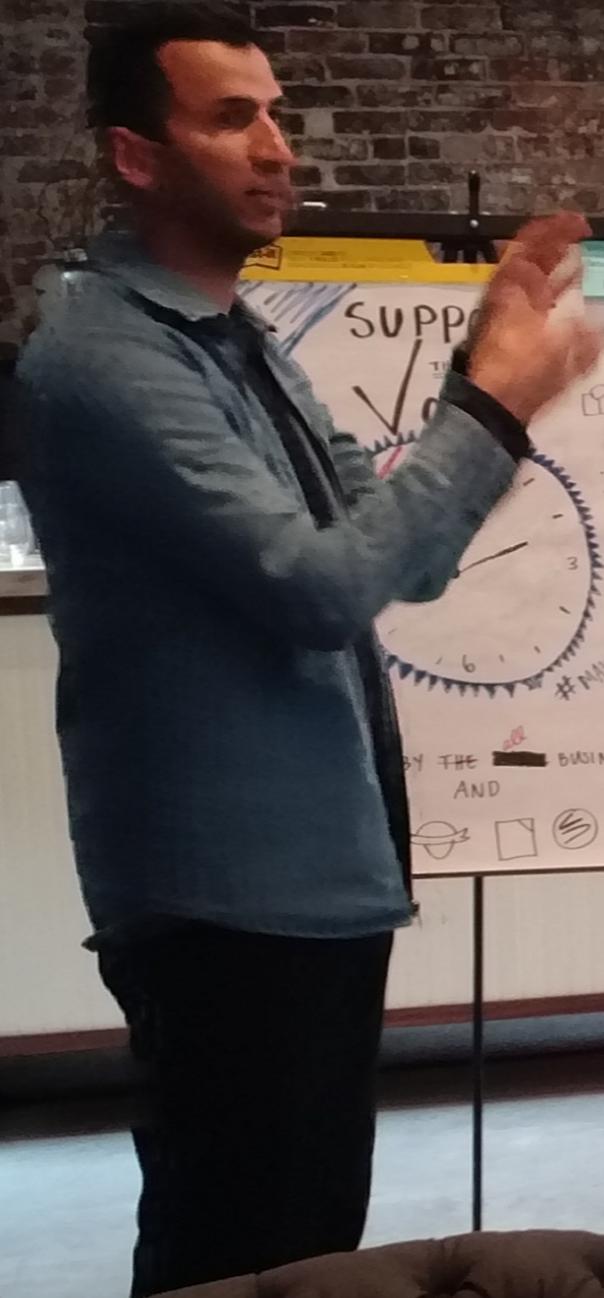

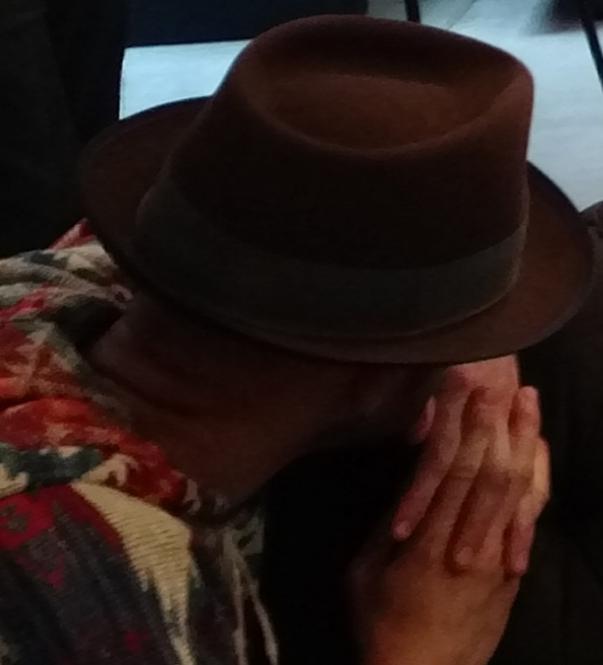
