





Complex Systems and limitations of Design tools

Gigamapping is identified as an extension of the Soft System Methodology (Sevaldson, 2011).

However, it's approach suggests that systems can be rationally analysed and explicitly mapped, which suggests the methods to be structuralist.

Metaphors are able to grasp lived experiences, elevating the embodied and uniquely placebased understanding of complex systems


























Metaphors for building awareness of the co-existing versions of realities (as experienced by different stakeholders) and its situatedness within a complex system.
