

Why use the Adaptive Cycle?



RESILIENT RESTAURANTS FOR THE FUTURE OF NEW ORLEANS

New Orleans is one of the best food cities in the world - and almost every neighborhood in our city has a great restaurant or two. When the next hurricane hits..... those restaurants could become the "first first responder" for our community. . . we want to help empower them to serve their neighborhood.....

This can be done through solar + batteries, making each restaurant a micro-grid. Then, when the power goes out, that restaurant will still have power. Freezers and fridges stay operational, and lots of food is kept safe . . . instead of throwing away thousands of pounds of food, the restaurant can use that to feed the community....

in addition to saving food waste, a "Stay Lit" restaurant can become a cooling center, a phone charging center, a fooddistribution hub, and a place where neighbors can grab a little ice.....


additional benefits are: less job interruptions, stronger small businesses, more compassion in relief-work (as it's local)



- Develop questions or hypotheses based on your use of the framework and share them with the group



 - You may come back to this and fill in as your memory is jogged


Release

- What did you learn here?


Reorganization

- How quickly/slowly did this happen?


Exploitation

- How slowly of quickly is the scaling happening?


